**** All students will compile and submit a Senior Portfolio to fulfill requirement for this degree.

***** No additional courses can be taken when students are enrolled in student teaching EDSE 4341 and EDPD 4398 during their final semester.

NOTE: At least 36 hours of advanced work (3000- or 4000-level courses) for which tuition is paid must be earned at WTAMU. A maximum of six semester hours in religion (RELI) and six semester hours in physical education (PHED) courses can count toward a baccalaureate degree.

^Transfer & WT GPA combined must be 2.75.

NOTE: This is NOT a degree plan. All undergraduate students must request an official degree plan from their academic dean's office by the time they have completed 30 credit hours.

Prerequisites/Important Sequences/Other Degree Notes: Follow the education sequence of classes as listed above. During the first semester of the senior year, students are expected to participate in paid substitute teaching one day per week. In their junior year, second semester, students must complete 40 hours of observation and take the practice content test. No additional course work may be taken the semester a student enrolls in student teaching. Journalism certification majors will complete the MCOM portfolio assignment their senior year.
