

## Bacterial Meningitis Medical Exemption

To claim a medical exemption from the bacterial meningitis vaccine requirement set forth by Texas Senate Bill 1107 that requires all first-time, transferring or returning students attending an institution of higher education to provide evidence of vaccination against bacterial meningitis, you must obtain a waiver, signed by a physician who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine in the United States, stating that, in the physician's opinion, the required vaccination would be injurious to your health and well-being.
