The Department of English and Modern Languages, located on the fourth floor of the Classroom Center, offers courses in English, French, German, Spanish, philosophy and religion, with undergraduate majors in English and Spanish, as well as a master of arts degree in English. The department also offers secondary teacher certification majors in English and Spanish and a secondary composite in English language arts. In addition, English or Spanish may be selected as a second teaching field with other certification majors. The student who majors in interdisciplinary studies may complete elementary specialization in either English or Spanish. Further information regarding certification majors and interdisciplinary requirements appears in the Division of Education section of this catalog. These majors prepare students for a variety of after-college routes: graduate study, professional school, and careers in such diverse fields as writing, publishing, government and foreign service, human services, business and education.

In addition to major studies, the department offers courses that fill core curriculum requirements of the University. Freshman English sharpens communication skills, while world literature surveys broaden cultural perspectives. Certain philosophy and language courses can fulfill humanities requirements, and foreign language study is part of the bachelor of arts option.

As part of the Sybil B. Harrington College of Fine Arts and Humanities, the department shares in a high calling—to foster and preserve the art of human expression.

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Minor in English

General

- At least 18 hours in English, excluding courses below 2000.
- At least nine hours at 3000 and above.

Language Study Emphasis

- At least 18 hours in English, excluding courses below 2000.
- At least nine hours at or above 3000, to be selected from ENGL 3310, 3311, 3312, 4310, 4311, SPAN 4320 and 4330.

Literature Emphasis

- At least 18 hours in English, excluding courses below 2000 and ENGL 2311.
- At least nine hours at 3000 and above (must include ENGL 3380); remaining hours in any assortment from 3321, 3323, 3331, 3332, 3341, 3342, 3350, 3351, 3352, 3360, 3361, 3362, 3381, 3392, 3394, 4322, 4332, 4350, 4351, 4352, 4353, 4360, 4361 and 4393.

Writing Emphasis

- 18 hours in English, excluding courses below 2311, selected from ENGL 2311, 3301, 3302, 3303, 3304, 3392, 3394, 4301 and 4393.
- To be counted for the minor in English, emphasis in writing, 3392, 3394 and 4393 hours must be projects in writing.

Minor in Philosophy

- PHIL 1301*.
- Completion of two of the following advanced courses: PHIL 3301, 3302 or 4302.
- Completion of course work in three of the following areas**:
 - Economic Philosophy—ECON 4361.
 - Political Theory—POSC 3365 or 4366.
 - Socio-Ethical Theory—IDS 3301, PHIL 2374 or SOCI 4361.
 - Aesthetics—ARTS 4370 or ENGL 3380.
 - Theories of Meaning—ENGL 4311 or PHIL 2303.
 - Metaphysics/Epistemology—PHIL 3394, 3392 or 4302 when appropriate.

Of the 18 required credit hours, at least nine must be from courses listed in philosophy at or above the 3000 level.

*PHIL 1301 may be waived as a requirement upon the student's successful completion of both PHIL 3301 and 3302.

**PHIL 3394, 3392 or 4302 may be used to fulfill any of the area requirements when the topic directly addresses that area. The professor will expressly indicate in his or her syllabus or course description what area requirement(s) are covered by the course.

Minor in Spanish

At least 18 hours in Spanish, including 2311, 2312, 3315, 4375 and six semester hours of advanced Spanish electives.
