The Department of History and Geography offers courses in American, East Asian, Western European and public history designed to prepare students for careers in these fields.

The Department of History and Geography has an excellent collection of source material available in Cornette Library: unusually complete files of scholarly journals, more than 600,000 government documents, microfilm and microcard acquisitions, (including a complete file of *The New York Times* and records of the U.S. Congress from 1789 to the present). Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum, located on the southern edge of campus, has a superb regional collection of books, journals, and thousands of manuscript items and recorded interviews with pioneers of the area.

History Core Requirements

- HIST 1301, 1302, or 2301 (choose two); 2302, 2311, two of 2370, 2371 or 2373; 3301, 4301, plus 21 semester hours of advanced history, nine of which must be in U.S. history and nine of which must be in non-U.S. history.

Prerequisite for Advanced Work (3000- and 4000-level courses)

- Six semester hours of history unless otherwise indicated.
- HIST 2302.

For information about the master of arts (M.A.) degree in history, refer to the “Graduate School” section of this catalog.

Minor in History

- 18 hours of history, including two of the University U.S. history core options (HIST 1301, 1302 or 2301) and one of the following: HIST 2311, 2370, 2371, 2372, or 2373 and nine hours of advanced courses.

Minor in Public History

- Only available in conjunction with either a B.A. or B.S. degree in history.
- 18 hours of history courses, including HIST 3302, either 3304 or 3305, six hours from the “general” list of public-history course options as delineated by the public history coordinator and six hours of public history internship.

Minor in Museum Studies

- Only available in conjunction with either a B.A. or B.S. degree in history.
- 18 hours of history courses, including HIST 3302, either 3304 or 3305, six hours of museum studies courses, and six hours of museum internship.

Minor in International Studies—Europe

- 18 hours, nine of which must be at the advanced level, three in residence.
- Demonstrated competency in French, German, Spanish, Portuguese or another European language, subject to approval by the International Studies Governing Committee.
- 12 hours of area-related course work.
- Students are strongly encouraged to study abroad.

Minor in International Studies—East Asia

- 18 hours, nine of which must be at the advanced level, three in residence.
- Demonstrated competency in Japanese or another European language, subject to approval by the International Studies Governing Committee.
- 12 hours of area-related course work, six from any field, three of which may come from the “general” list.
- Students are strongly encouraged to study abroad.

Minor in International Studies—Latin America

- 18 hours, nine of which must be at the advanced level, three in residence.
- Demonstrated competency in Spanish, Portuguese or a relevant indigenous language, subject to approval by the International Studies Governing Committee.
- 12 hours of area-related course work.
- Students are strongly encouraged to study abroad.
