Who takes this program?

- New and experienced teachers.
- Teachers who want to study current research on best practices and curriculum development.
- Teachers who would like to work as curriculum specialists in school districts.

How does the program work?

- 36-hour program.
- Can be completed in two years.
- Most courses are online, but some may be taught in a classroom setting.

How will this degree benefit me?

Graduates of the program use their knowledge of curriculum development to improve their own classroom curriculum or to become curriculum specialists in school districts.

What courses will I take?

- 18 hours of graduate level core education coursework.
- 18 additional hours of graduate level coursework.
- At least six hours are taken outside of education. Other areas of study include education and content areas.

What sets this program apart from other programs?

This program has flexibility for both elementary, middle school, secondary, or junior college educators in that the core requirements consist of 18 hours and the other 18 hours of coursework of are designed to meet each student's professional goals.

Admission Criteria and Application Guidelines

Full Admission

- Undergraduate grade point average (G.P.A.) of 3.0 or higher.
- Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended.
- Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores in the 50th percentile or higher in one or more testing area (verbal, quantitative, analytical writing).

Conditional Admission

Any applicant who does not meet the above requirements will be reviewed for possible conditional admission.

Deadline to Apply

- August 1 for Fall admission
- December 1 for Spring admission
- May 1 for Summer admission
