♦ A minimum of 42 hours from the core curriculum is required. Some majors specify particular courses to meet core-curriculum requirements when options are available. Ideally, these courses should be taken during the first two years of enrollment.
* Indicates prerequisites—see catalog for more information.
** While MATH 1332 will fulfill core math requirements, it will NOT prepare students for math beyond MATH 1332 such as Plane Trigonometry (MATH 1316), Pre-Calculus (MATH 2412), etc.
*** Or an equivalent course (second year, second semester) in French or German.

NOTE: For the B.G.S. degree, students must complete, in addition to the core curriculum, a minimum of 78 hours of electives, including at least 39 hours at the advanced level (3000- or 4000-level courses). Some advanced course work is available online. At least 39 hours of advanced work for which tuition is paid must be earned at WTAMU, and 30 of the final 36 hours counted toward the degree must be earned at WTAMU. A maximum of 36 hours in one academic discipline can count toward this degree. A maximum of six semester hours in religion (REL) and six semester hours in physical education (PHED) courses can count toward a baccalaureate degree.

¹Twenty-four of the 36 hours in academic concentrations must be advanced (3000- or 4000-level). There are no restrictions on how advanced hours are distributed throughout the academic concentrations requirement. Only six hours of core curriculum classes can be applied to the academic concentrations requirements.
²An academic discipline is designated by a course prefix, as ENGL for English or POSC for political science. The following are exceptions:

- Music courses, whether MUSI (music), MUAP (applied music) or MUEN (music ensemble) are counted as one academic discipline.
- Any combination of the following can be applied to a concentration in education: EDEC, EDEL, EDPD, EDRD, EDSE, EDSP, EDT and EPSY.

Note: This is NOT a degree plan. Before completion of 60 hours, students are allowed and encouraged to request an official degree plan in the office of the dean of the Sybil B. Harrington College of Fine Arts and Humanities, located in Mary Moody Northern Hall, Room 161 (or call 651-2777). After completing 60 hours, students will not be allowed to progress without requesting a degree plan.
