NOTES (e.g. prerequisite issues; recommendations for summer; recommended electives or core options; helpful sequencing info. where no specific prerequisite requirements are listed; good exploratory courses or “not recommended for non-majors”; course rotation notes; etc.):

- ENGL 1302 and 2311 prerequisite: ENGL 1301.
- ¹ENGL 2000-level options prerequisites: ENGL 1302/2311.
- All upper-level (3000 and 4000) ENGL courses require 6 hours English credit as prerequisite.
- ENGL 4301: offered every second or third Fall. ENGL 4305 prerequisite: ENGL 1301 and 1302/2311.
- Of the required upper-level ENGL courses, some are especially beneficial if taken as early as possible. ENGL 3380 should be taken at the earliest opportunity, and is appropriate taken simultaneously with 2000-level literature courses. The survey courses should also be taken as early as possible: ENGL 3350, 3351, 3360, 3361, 3383.
- The ENGL Language Requirement courses (ENGL 3311 and 3312) tend to fill quickly, so look for opportunities. These courses can be taken in either order (they have no prerequisite relationship).
- The other Language Requirement courses are Foreign Languages (SPAN, GERM, FREN, or JAPN). Generally speaking, we strongly recommend completing the requirement in one language and in back-to-back semesters or sessions.
- Good summer course picks include Language Requirement courses (ENGL 3311, 3312, Foreign Languages) and upper-division ENGL requirements and electives.
- Rotation of course offerings may vary; contact departmental advisor or department head concerning future availability of particular course.
- See the Catalog for explanation of the Capstone requirement (fulfilled final long semester before graduation).
