The Panhandle AHEC Scholars Program . . .

Was developed as a national program grant funded through the Health Resource and Service Administration (HRSA).

Is designed for health professions students who are interested in pursuing careers in rural and/or underserved communities after graduation.

Is accepting new applicants who have a passion for serving in rural and medically underserved communities!

Panhandle AHEC Scholars

The AHEC Scholars Program is a unique opportunity for health and health related discipline students to gain professional experience working in an interprofessional team-based community or clinical care setting, while they are still in school.

This two-year program offers didactic and practical learning experiences that enhances students' traditional curricula by offering opportunities to:

- Learn more about the roles and responsibilities of other health professions.
- Work in team-based environments that foster inclusivity and focus on patient-centered care.
- Broaden their scope of practice and learn strategies to become better practitioners.
- Learn and understand the unique challenges that face underserved and rural populations when accessing care and achieving good health status.

AHEC Scholar Prerequisites

Students must:


Be enrolled in a health professions training program (minimum 2 years in length, some exceptions apply).

Be in good academic standing.

Have reliable transportation and access to WiFi.

Possess a strong work ethic.

Display effective organizational, time management, and communication skills.

AHEC Scholar Program Requirements



Each student must complete 40 hours of clinical/experiential training, which are:

- Interdisciplinary
- Team-based experiences in Texas rural and/or medically underserved areas
- Located in healthcare facilities, such as designated patient-centered medical homes, academic clinics, student run clinics, community-health centers, etc.

Clinical hours (which meet the requirements above) that students participate in as part of their academic programs will also count for AHEC Scholar clinical hours requirements!

AHEC Scholar Didactic Content

Each student must complete a minimum of 40 hours per year of didactic training (online, self-paced) in the HRSA defined 6 core topic areas.

Didactic (online, self-paced) training will supplement students' existing health professions training program curriculum.

Students must complete a program evaluation each year, including a one-year post-graduation follow-up.



AHEC Scholars Term/Year

AHEC Scholars Program is a 2-year program

Students must commit to being in the program for 2 years, plus complete a third-year longitudinal survey.

Entry point into the program is dependent on each student's school/program with the exit point at graduation or completion of the degree.

The 2025-26 AHEC Scholars Cohort will begin with orientations scheduled during the third week of September.

Applications due September 9, 2025

AHEC Scholars program begins with orientations in late September 2025
