Why did you choose to study in Mexico and Nicaragua?

My choice to study in Nicaragua was one hundred percent based on the passion and mission of Susan Amos, a professor here at WT. She spoke so incredibly highly of the culture and the people that I would have been crazy to not have taken that opportunity. It was while in Nicaragua that I decided that I, for sure, wanted to study abroad longterm before my time at WT came to an end. I chose Mexico over other Spanish speaking countries like Spain and Costa Rica because Mexico holds a special place in my heart. They are our neighbors, and so many people in this area hold have such strong ties to their heritage in Mexico. I knew it is where I wanted to go, so I found a program that fit that desire.



What is your favorite memory from studying abroad?

I've been to tea parties before, but never had I ever been to what my teammate Sarah and I coined as a "Nicaraguan Tea Party." Let me explain. It was our last day with the students of the school we had been working with throughout the week, and some of the older girls we had built a relationship with wanted us to come to sit with them and their friends. We all sat in a circle, and they brought out cups from the kitchen, poured us each a cup of Coca-Cola (which is arguably so much better in Central America), and gave us a napkin with an assortment of chips and candy. We sat there laughing and talking for what seems now as such a short period of time. Out of all the adventures we had, this was by far my favorite memory of Nicaragua. In Mexico, every day with my host mom was my favorite. She is one of the coolest, strongest, most interesting women I have ever met in my life. She absolutely loves her students like they are her own. The stories she would tell and the love she gives made even my hardest days abroad worth it. Also, did I mention she made the most delicious food I have ever eaten?!

What advice would you give to students who plan to study abroad?

Leave your expectations at the airport. Everything you think your experience is going to be like is nothing like what it will be like. Don't let your own expectations be the thing that ruins your time. Be flexible, be open, and be kind, and you are set!

Why should other students study abroad?

I think studying abroad shouldn't be an "if" for students, instead it should be a "when." I believe everyone should experience an international culture aside from their own. It is a vast world, and it is remarkably humbling to realize your way of life is not the only way. People have so much to teach us, and getting out of your comfort zone makes you so much more willing to learn from them.

SUMMARY OF QUALIFICATIONS [OR PROFILE]

- Brief statements of your experience, training and/or personal abilities
- Summarizes experience and calls attention to your skills
- · Highlights what you have to offer an employer

Think of all you've gained from your study abroad experience that employers value:

- Critical thinking and problemsolving skills developed through navigating a new environment
- · Leaderships skills
- Global/intercultural fluency
- Oral/written communication (Did you improve in another language?)

WORK HISTORY OR EXPERIENCE

NAME OF BUSINESS Job Title

- Bullet statements are used to highlight job accomplishments; what did you do to make this organization better?
- A bullet statement can also be used here to detail job duties you performed that may not be expected based on your job title.

Did you work or complete a project while you were abroad? You could list that in a section labeled "Experience."

Note: You can have both Work History AND Experience sections.

ACTIVITIES AND HONORS [OR INVOLVEMENT]

- College scholarships, honors, organizations, and memberships
- Community work, volunteer work is also appropriate to list here

Your study abroad experience shows you were an engaged student on campus, and it adds something interesting to your resume.
