Basic steps for using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (IRS DRT)

- ✤ <u>www.fafsa.gov</u>
 - Log in to your 23/24 FAFSA
 - o Make FAFSA corrections
 - o Navigate to financial information section, follow instructions to determine if eligible to use IRS DRT
 - o If eligible, transfer 2021 IRS income tax information into your FAFSA

A 2021 IRS Tax Return Transcript may be obtained through:

- Get Transcript <u>ONLINE</u> Go to <u>www.irs.gov</u>, click "Get Your Tax Record." Click "Get Transcript ONLINE." Make sure to request the "Return Transcript" and **NOT** the "Account Transcript." To use the Get Transcript Online tool, the user must have (1) access to a valid email address, (2) a text-enabled mobile phone (pay-asyou-go plans cannot be used) in the user's name, and (3) specific financial account numbers (such as a credit card number or an account number for a home mortgage or auto loan). The transcript displays online upon successful completion of the IRS's two-step authentication.
- Get Transcript by <u>MAIL</u> Go to <u>www.irs.gov</u>, click "Get Your Tax Record." Click "Get Transcript by MAIL." Make sure to request the "Return Transcript" and **NOT** the "Account Transcript."
- ✤ <u>Automated Telephone Request</u> 1-800-908-9946.
- Paper Request Form Download form 4506-T from <u>www.irs.gov</u>, mail or fax the completed form to the appropriate address (or fax number) at the IRS.

A 2021 IRS Non-Filing Tax Transcript may be obtained through:

- Get Transcript <u>ONLINE</u> Go to <u>www.irs.gov</u>, click "Get Your Tax Record." Click "Get Transcript ONLINE." Select Verification of Non-Filing.
- Get Transcript by <u>MAIL</u> IRS Form 4506-T or 4506T-EZ from <u>www.irs.gov</u>, mail or fax the completed form to the appropriate address (or fax number) at the IRS. Make sure to check box 7 for 'Verification of Nonfiling'.

Have the IRS send tax return transcripts to you or your parents, <u>NOT</u> to the WTAMU Financial Aid Office. Then you or your parents will submit copies to WTAMU Financial Aid with your name and Buff ID number along with a notation of whether the report is for student, spouse, or parent.

D. Certification and Signatures

Each person signing this worksheet certifies that all of the information reported is complete and correct. The student and (if student is dependent) one parent whose information was reported on the FAFSA must sign and date.
