In celebration of National Student Employment Week, we proudly recognize the hardworking students who contribute so much to the success and spirit of West Texas A&M University. Student employees play a vital role in keeping our campus community thriving, balancing academics, jobs, and personal growth while gaining valuable skills that prepare them for their future careers. Their dedication, resilience, and commitment to excellence exemplify what it means to be a Buff.

Currently, over 870 students are employed across campus, helping support operations in academic departments, student services, research, and more. The majority of these student employees, 747 of them serve as student workers, while 126 hold graduate assistant positions. Most student employees are in the traditional college-age range, with the largest group being students in their early twenties. These student workers represent a diverse community: 517 female, 347 male, and 200 students identifying as Hispanic/Latino, along with many others contributing from various backgrounds. Their presence enriches WT's campus culture and creates a welcoming and inclusive environment for all.

Beyond demographics, the data shows that student employment at WT is truly an entry point to professional development. Most student employees are early in their careers, with fewer than five years of service in the Texas A&M University System, demonstrating that WT is a launching pad for growth. Whether they are helping in classrooms, supporting campus operations, or assisting faculty with research, student workers are gaining real-world experience, building leadership, and shaping their futures.
