

All applicants must possess an associate degree and have a BAAS Block of technical/vocational credits (up to a maximum of 36 hours) that will be converted to academic hours prior to admission. 
NOTE II: At least 36 hours of advanced work (3000- or 4000-level courses) for which tuition is paid must be earned at WTAMU, and 30 of the final 36 hours counted toward the degree must be earned at WTAMU. A maximum of six semester hours in religion (RELI) and six semester hours in physical education (PHED) courses can count toward a baccalaureate degree.




