Ar Criteria for admission to the Social Work Program: All students registering as social work majors will be considered pre-majors before they are officially admitted into the Social Work Program. The criteria for admission are: completion of the University's core curriculum courses, including biology; completion of the beginning-level social work courses-2361, 2315 and 3301-with a grade of "C" or better; a cumulative grade point average of 2.25 or higher; an application for admission to the program accompanied by (1) at least two letters of reference from people who can attest to the student's desire and commitment to helping people, and (2) the student's latest transcripts; and the filing of a degree plan with the dean of the College of Education and Social Sciences.

NOTE: This is NOT a degree plan. All undergraduate students must request an official degree plan from their academic dean's office by the time they have completed 30 credit hours.
