Upon completion of the WTAMU Pre-Nursing admission requirements, there is a second, competitive application process to be admitted to the BSN program. A basic or transfer student who is <u>not</u> enrolled in courses in one of the four official nursing semesters (Junior I, Junior II, Senior I, and Senior II) is considered to be a Pre-Nursing major, Code 700. When a student is admitted to the WTAMU BSN program and begins Junior I nursing courses, the major code is changed to Code 701, unless the student is a registered LVN, in which case the major is changed to 713.

Some majors specify particular courses to meet core curriculum requirements when options are available. - At least 36 hours of advanced work (3000- or 4000-level courses) for which tuition is paid must be earned at WTAMU. A maximum of six semester hours in religion (RELI) and six semester hours in physical education (PHED) courses can count toward a baccalaureate degree.
