- \*\* While MATH 1332, 1342 and 1350 will fulfill core math requirements, they will NOT prepare students for higher-level math courses such as Plane Trigonometry (MATH 1316) or Pre-Calculus (MATH 2412).
- \*\*\* Or an equivalent course (second year, second semester) in a foreign language.

**NOTE I:** This degree assumes completion of an associate of applied science degree at a community college or completion of an appropriate occupational certificate prior to starting work on the B.A.A.S. degree at WTAMU. Included in this credit must be a block of transfer of technical-vocational credits, up to a maximum of 48 hours. Additional hours of academic credit may be transferred.

**NOTE II:** At least 36 hours of advanced work (3000- or 4000-level courses) for which tuition is paid must be earned at WTAMU. A maximum of 60 semester hours in any single discipline, six hours in religion (REL) and six hours in physical education (PHED) can be counted toward a degree. A maximum of 30 semester hours in business courses (ACCT, BUSI, CIDM, ECON, FIN, MGT, MKT), including 6 semester hours in the Core Curriculum, may count toward this degree.

**NOTE:** This is NOT a degree plan. All undergraduate students must request an official degree plan from their academic dean's office by the time they have completed 30 credit hours.

Some majors specify particular courses to meet core curriculum requirements when options are available.
- At least 36 hours of advanced work (3000- or 4000-level courses) for which tuition is paid must be earned at WTAMU. A maximum of six semester hours in religion (RELI) and six semester hours in physical education (PHED) courses can count toward a baccalaureate degree. A maximum of 30 semester hours in business courses (ACCT, BUSI, CIDM, ECON, FIN, MGT, MKT), including 6 semester hours in the Core Curriculum, may count toward this degree. Students on this PDC are not allowed to pursue a minor from the College of Business. (The minor will exceed the maximum hours of business courses allowed.)

\* ECON 2301 or 2302 are recommended for Core 80 as these courses are prerequisites for several upper level ECON courses in the PDC options.

\*\*\* It is recommended to take BUSI 3312 as one of the PDC course options as this course is prerequisite to some of the PDC course options.

\*\* Do not take business courses (ACCT, BUSI, CIDM, ECON, FIN, MGT, MKT) in Advanced Electives section.
