Some majors specify particular courses to meet core curriculum requirements when options are available.

- \*\* While MATH 1332, 1342 and 1350 will fulfill core math requirements, they will NOT prepare students for higher-level math courses such as Plane Trigonometry (MATH 1316) or Pre-Calculus (MATH 2412).
- \*\*\* Or an equivalent course (second year, second semester) in a foreign language.

**NOTE I:** For the B.G.S. degree, students must complete, in addition to the core curriculum, a minimum of 78 hours of electives, including at least 36 hours at the advanced level (3000- or 4000-level courses).

**NOTE II:** A maximum of 36 hours in one academic discipline may count toward this degree. An academic discipline is designated by a course prefix, such as ENGL for English or POSC for political science. Music courses (whether MUAP, MUEN, MUMI, or MUSI) are counted as one academic discipline. Education courses (whether EDEC, EDEL, EDPD, EDRD, EDSE, EDSP, EDT, or EPSY) are counted as one academic discipline. A maximum of six semester hours in religion (RELI) and six semester hours in physical education (PHED) courses may count toward a baccalaureate degree. A maximum of 30 semester hours in business courses (ACCT, BUSI, CIDM, ECON, FIN, MGT, MKT), including 6 semester hours in the Core Curriculum, may count toward this degree.

Refer to the *Content Hour Requirements Per Certification Area (PDF)* link under *Step 1* for help choosing Advanced and Any-Level Electives coursework to meet admission requirements into the PACE program.
