Apart from the major-specific core requirements, there is no set order in which core courses must be taken.

<sup>2</sup> **CORE 20:** MATH 1314 recommended; satisfies pre- requisite to both NURS 3304 and CHEM 1305/CHEM 1411; MATH 1332 satisfies the prerequisite for CHEM 1305, but not 1411. MATH 1342 and 1350 do not satisfy the prerequisite for either CHEM 1305 or 1411. MATH 1342 satisfies NURS 3304.

**Additional notes:**

- The core curriculum must total exactly 42 hours; excess hours must be moved to the major as an elective or a major requirement and stay within the 120-hour requirement or approved total submitted to the Coordinating Board for degree requirements. Some majors specify particular courses to meet core curriculum requirements when options are available.
- At least 36 hours of advanced work (3000- or 4000-level courses) for which tuition is paid must be earned at WTAMU. A maximum of six semester hours in religion (RELI) and six semester hours in physical education (PHED) courses can count toward a baccalaureate degree.

The degree checklist (later a student's official degree plan) should be referred to as the comprehensive list of all courses required for the degree.
