Air Quality Research in the Western US (AQUARIUS) Workshop

This was a science workshop funded by the National Science Foundation that occurred in September 2019.

Description of Research Project

The goal of this science workshop (funded by the National Science Foundation in September 2019) was to bring together experts from all over the world (125 in total) to plan for a major research study planned in December 2022-February 2023 in the Western US to investigate how wintertime particulate matter forms in mountain basins during inversion conditions.

Expected Publication of the Research Results

The AQUARIUS workshop successfully identified the research priorities of such a study, including atmospheric chemistry, the weather conditions that trap pollution in basins, and the measurements needed to understand pollution emissions sources across urban and rural areas. The steering is currently composing a white paper on the science needs for the upcoming AQUARIUS aircraft and ground-based study that will be made publicly available in 2020 on the AQUARIUS website: https://atmos.utah.edu/aquarius/

The key points of the white paper will be delivered to an upcoming paper in the Bulletin of the American Meteorological Society. In addition, the outcomes of this science conference will be critical in leading to the study design of the major AQUARIUS field study to be conducted in the western US in 2022-2023.
