Beginning June 1, 2020, West Texas A&M University will be a completely tobacco/vape-free campus. Revisions to the current tobacco policy were adopted March 3 and are an important step toward ensuring the health and safety of our campus community and visitors.

The new policy prohibits the use of all tobacco products (including vape products), smokeless tobacco products, and any illegal smoking products on all University properties, facilities, and state vehicles—including the use of these products in personal vehicles while on campus property. Prohibited products include cigarettes, cigars, snuff, chewing tobacco and snuff products, vape pens, e-cigarettes, and hookahs.

Rules governing the use of these products in residence halls can be found in the Code of Student Life Handbook.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in helping WT join more than 2,400 colleges and universities across the county in eliminating secondhand smoke exposure, discouraging the use of use of harmful products, and encouraging tobacco users to kick the habit. The University has and continues to promote prevention and cessation programs.

In order to meet the needs of WT students and their families who have been impacted by the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, WT will award over \$2.88 million to assist students as part of its WT CARES PROGRAM. These allocations are designed to provide grants to students for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus. The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act funds will be used to address financial hardship, including housing and food insecurity, medical expenses, and lack of educational support and supplies (including technology). # Fantastic Faculty

## Dr. Joseph Cepeda presents on: "Geological Framework of the Ogallala Formation"

On February 21, 2020, Dr. Joseph Cepeda, Professor of Geology, was invited to present his talk titled "Geological Framework of the Ogallala Formation" at the 2020 Southern Plains Conference, held in Canyon, Texas. This research traced the evolution of ideas on the origins of the Ogallala Formation from 1899 to present day.

For more than 120 years, geologists have recognized the abundance of groundwater contained within the Ogallala and the reality that most of the water is contained in the lower part of the formation - ideas that still remain true today.

## Dr. Naruki Hiranuma Partners with The U.S. Department of Energy



The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) recently published a press release highlighting the research of Dr. Naruki Hiranuma, Assistant Professor of Environmental Science. Dr. Hiranuma's research was conducted at the Atmospheric Radiation Measurement (ARM) user facility and funded by DOE. In October and November 2019, Hiranuma, an expert in advanced aerosol measurement techniques, led a campaign he called Examining Ice Nucleating Particles (ExINP). This campaign provided the first automated and continuous measurements of ambient ice-nucleating particle (INP) concentrations—for 45 days straight at intervals of roughly every six minutes. Hiranuma's work, supplemented by ARM data, involved the first field deployment of the Portable Ice Nucleation Experiment chamber (PINE). PINE is a one-of-a-kind device that makes artificial clouds and uses aerosol particle detectors to monitor the abundance and characteristics of INPs. [Read more](#)
