Hello,

Students making application to pharmacy schools should have completed at least two full academic years of pre-pharmacy education with the majority of students having completed 3 or more years of undergraduate college experience prior to entering the Pharm D. programs. Pre-requisite courses will vary somewhat, based on the curriculum offered at the various schools.

Generally, the pharmacy school pre-requisite requirements are as follows:

Humanities/Social Sciences 15 hr minimum English, approximately 9 hrs
Economics, 3 hrs
Speech, 3 hrs
Statistics, 3 hrs
Calculus, 3 hrs
Microbiology with lab, 4 hrs
General Biology with labs, 8 hrs
General Physics with labs, 4 hrs
General Chemistry, with labs 8 hrs
Organic Chemistry, with labs 8 hrs
Vertebrate Anatomy with lab 8 hrs
Genetics, 3-4 hrs
