**Research Courses: EDLD 6000 Scholarly Delivery**

All Ed.D. candidates are required to complete 60 semester credit hours (SCH) derived from a combination of 48 SCHs of course work (which includes approved transfer and/or competency credit) plus 12 SCHs of EDLD 6000 Scholarly Delivery. EDLD 6000 is designed for your engagement in fulfilling the qualifying exam and scholarly delivery requirements. EDLD 6000 is a variable hour course. You have the flexibility to register for one, two, or three SCHs of credit each semester. The sections and associated SCH assignments are displayed in Table 1.

Once candidates enroll in their first EDLD 6000 course, they **must remain continuously enrolled** in at least one SCH of EDLD 6000 until graduation. In most cases, candidates are advised to enroll in only one SCH for the first few semesters, which saves hours for use as they approach graduation. In the event that candidates may need an additional semester or two beyond the prescribed 3-year timeframe to graduate, they can use those “saved” hours to avoid the additional cost of adding hours to the minimum 12 SCHs required. However, candidates still must manage EDLD 6000 hours tightly because the maximum that can be taken in any single semester is three. Occasionally candidates need to enroll in two or three hours in some semesters early in their program to meet financial aid minimum hour eligibility requirements. In short, each candidate’s situation dictates the manner in which they manage these hours and the responsibility belongs to the candidate.

**Required Enrollment Sequence**

Scholarly Delivery enrollment is reserved for (a) identifying the candidates’ problems of practice and writing their pedagogical case study (scholarly deliverable #1), (b) writing their qualifying exam (QE), and (c) working with their doctoral committee in conducting their own empirical research and writing their manuscripts (scholarly deliverable #2). Candidates who follow the 3-year graduation plan are expected to register for EDLD 6000 as follows:

**Research Courses: Research Design and Data Analysis**

The research design courses (RSCH 6311, RSCH 6313, and RSCH 6326) and advanced data analysis courses (RSCH 6312, RSCH 6314, and RSCH 6315) are sequenced in a prescribed order. The research design courses are to be taken in the order presented in Figure 2.

The research design courses, in the sequence prescribed are RSCH 6326 Research Designs, RSCH 6313 Qualitative Research Designs, and RSCH 6311 Quantitative Research Designs. The advanced courses, all focused on data analysis, are RSCH 6312 Advanced Quantitative Data Analysis, RSCH 6314 Advanced Mixed Methods Data Analysis, and RSCH 6315 Advanced Qualitative Data Analysis. Candidates are advised to choose the advanced data analysis course that will be most applicable to their empirical research. The advanced courses are offered in the fall semester of the second year in the program that is the semester prior to candidates' final year in the program where emphasis is placed on their empirical research.
