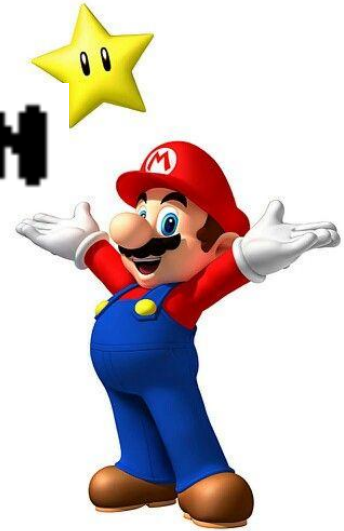

I am looking forward to a great year! GO BUFFS!

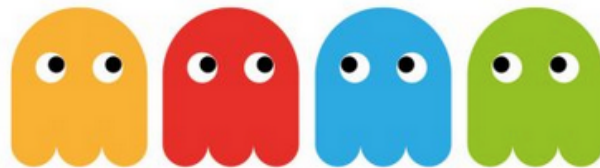

## This is the stuff you really want to know: Dorms, Moving In, Meals and More.

This is the info that you've been searching for.

**THE BIG NEWS - You do NOT have to sign up to volunteer for the dorm move-in.**

If you are a member of the Percussion Section or the Color Guard, you can move into the dorms on THURSDAY, AUGUST 12 between 3p and 5p. You move right into your assigned dorm. You will need a parking permit to park anywhere on campus.

Everyone else can move into their dorms from Friday through Sunday, also from 3p to 5p.

The band covers meals starting with the first meal AFTER YOU ARE REQUIRED TO REPORT. Percussion & Color Guard start with lunch on Friday. Freshmen, transfers, and returning students start with dinner on Monday. Your meal cards will kick in on Thursday, August 19. The cafeteria will not serve breakfast on the weekends until classes start, so grab a box of nutritious Pop Tarts for the weekend.

All of our meetings are held in Mary Moody Northen Hall, in room 1010. You'll see it abbreviated in a variety of ways: N, MM, MMNH, Northen, Mary Moody...it all refers to the same place. N 1010 is the rehearsal room for Band and Orchestra, and it's on the west side of the building (for the directionally challenged like me, that's the side that faces Taco Villa). Northen can be confusing to get around in for first-timers. The building is rectangular, the center is triangular, and the hall that connects the building to the addition is impossible to see until you're right on top of it. If you've been to Band Camp, you'll find it. If you're new to the campus, program Ensemble Secretary Tracy's number in your cell phone and she'll guide you to it from wherever you end up on campus (806-651-2854).

The first day will consist of a brief meeting, introductions, and tryouts (for percussionists). Percussion and color guard will have been working for a couple of days by the time everyone else gets here on Monday. Be prepared to introduce yourself (or someone else). Dress for outdoor marching on Monday, but don't bring your instrument.

There is a \$50 band fee. It gets you your band t-shirt, a water jug, a baseball cap, and free admission to the bands' annual Halloween and Christmas parties. You get more than your \$50 worth.

ODDS AND ENDS, BUT STILL IMPORTANT: Want to march Color Guard instead of your instrument (woodwind preferred)? Indicate that in your [band e-card](#) and indicate Color Guard in addition to your primary instrument. THE REALLY BIG ADVICE IS RELATIVELY SHORT. Show up to your ensembles whether you're prepared or not. If you're not prepared, you might get called out on it, but NOTHING like if you blow it off. As far as your classes go, remember that you, or someone who loves you, is paying big bucks for you to be here. Get your/their money's worth. Your director or GA might give you a "friendly reminder" phone call telling you to get your butt out of bed and get to your ensemble. No one will do that in your other classes. You'll just fail for non-attendance (The other myth I'll mention is believing you'll pass a class you haven't attended). The other piece of advice is to get involved. You'll meet your life-long friends and maybe even your spouse or partner here, and you won't do that locked in your dorm room playing Mortal Kombat.

### Pertinent Details:

- If you are a music major at WTAMU, you must audition over the entire packet.
- Listen to and study the suggested recordings of each piece listed above.
- Practicing slowly with a metronome is the key to mastering difficult passages. During the audition, you will be asked to use a metronome on every excerpt, unless otherwise specified by the faculty member.
- Accuracy is important, but so is tempo.
- Discover the intonation tendencies of your instrument. There are electronic tuning devices available to you at a very affordable price. BUY ONE, and begin this process! TUNERS AND HOOKUPS or KORG ATTACHABLE TUNERS ARE REQUIRED!
- Don't procrastinate! The music is too challenging to learn in only a few days prior to the audition.
- You will be auditioning for the following:
- Flute, Oboe, Bassoon, E-flat Clarinet/B-flat Clarinet, B-flat Clarinet, Bass Clarinet, Alto Saxophone (if you do not have access to an alto, you may audition on tenor or bari), Trumpet, Horn, Tenor Trombone, Bass Trombone, Euphonium, Tuba, String Bass and Percussion.
- First Inside Rehearsal: Monday, October 1, 2021.
- First Concert: Wednesday, December 1, 2021.
- Additional things that you will need to know:
- The Symphonic Band will begin sectionals shortly after the band auditions.

### Concert Attire – Formal Wear

The men will be wearing concert black attire; consisting of a black tux with a white tux shirt, black bow tie, black socks and black shoes. Females will order the appropriate attire after the start of the fall. In addition, they will need closed-toe shoes with black hose or socks.

## Orchestra Auditions

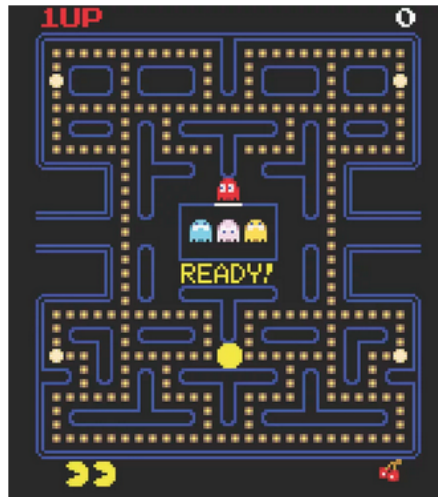
