



Alternative Admissions Policy

Students who meet the minimum GPA requirement of 2.0 (4.0 scale) will be reviewed on an individual basis with considerations given to a combination of GPA, Class Rank, High School Curriculum, and Standardized Test Scores (if available). Students may need to submit a Counselor Recommendation Form as part of the alternative admissions process.

**We encourage students to sit for the ACT or SAT tests, as consideration for most university scholarships require an official test score.*

ADMISSION Steps

Freshman Requirements

- High School Class Rank - Top 30%
- or
- 3.0 Cumulative High School GPA (4.0 Scale)
- or
- 21 ACT Composite Score or 1060 SAT Composite Score

All other freshman applicants will be reviewed by committee.

Transfer Requirements

Transfer Credit Hours*	Minimum GPA (4.0 Scale)
<12 hours	2.0 GPA and must meet freshman requirements**
≥12	2.0 GPA

* Dual credit and coursework in progress do not count toward transferrable credit hours.
** Applicants must submit an official high school transcript with class rank and ACT/SAT scores.
