


## BE **YOU** AT WT

Buffalo Stadium comes to life when Thunder runs across the field to kick off every home football game.




### **Homecoming Weekend**


### CAMPUS SPA

### **ADVISING**

Don't let the "sticker price" scare you - there are many kinds of financial aid and scholarships available to WT students. Most students pay thousands of dollars less than the actual cost of attendance.

Here are some ways WT students get help paying for college:



### **NO-COST-TO-STUDENT TEXTBOOKS**

At WT, in all classes that are part of the core curriculum, students will not have to pay for textbooks. This initiative can save a freshman student up to \$2,200 in textbook expenses over their first two years of college.



### **BUFF PROMISE**

WT's Buff Promise program covers fall and spring in-state tuition for undergraduate Texas residents who have an annual family income of \$80,000—the median income level for our region—or less. Buff Promise is designed to reassure academically talented students from low- and middle-income families in Texas who may not feel that a university education is possible.

## **SCHOLARSHIPS**

WT awards approximately \$8 million each year in scholarships to new and continuing students, with the average award totaling \$1,500 per year.

Students who demonstrate academic excellence, leadership and special talent are considered for University scholarships. Apply for scholarships at **wtamu.edu/scholarships.** 

### **Freshman Scholarships**

Submit your best SAT/ACT scores to qualify for WT Merit Scholarships. If your scores meet or exceed the appropriate criteria, you will qualify for the corresponding scholarship amount.

December 1st is the priority deadline for incoming freshmen scholarships, so apply early!

## FRESHMAN ADMISSION

Apply as a Freshman if you plan to attend college right after high school, or if you have not previously enrolled at a college or university. Do you have dual credit hours? You will apply as a Freshman!

## TRANSFER ADMISSION

Apply as a Transfer Student if you are currently or have ever been enrolled at a college or university.

### **Transfer Requirements**

- Must have a 2.0 GPA in at least 12 graded semester hours of transferable course work.
- Only courses with grades of C or better will transfer.
