From world-class performance facilities to state-of-the-art engineering labs, WT has the right tools to help students succeed. The University's Hastings Electronic Learning Center has computers stationed throughout its five classrooms and open-access computer lab. The chemistry facilities include a solids and liquids NMR (nuclear magnetic resonance) for structure elucidation and chemical characterization. Other laboratories on campus include the Bell Helicopter Engineering Laboratory and the Brown Consulting Engineers Thermal and Fluids Laboratory. Plus, WT faculty make sure students receive a thorough and rigorous education that combines real-world, hands-on experiences to prepare them for challenging and fulfilling careers.





The campus is home to 11 residence halls as well as a cafeteria open for breakfast, lunch and dinner. Living on campus offers huge benefits for international students.
