


WT serves a diverse student population of almost 10,000 students with approximately 200 international students representing 55 different countries.

All international applicants must submit the following items for admission consideration:



cost of attendance

The estimated cost for an undergraduate and graduate international student at WT. International students who receive a university scholarship of \$1,000 or more are eligible to pay approximately 50% less (International In-State) cost.

scholarship dates and qualifications scholarship dates

February 1

University scholarship priority date; applicants will be notified by May 1.

October 1

Scholarship application opens.

December 1

Early action date (freshmen only); applicants will be notified by Feb. 1.

- Enrolled full-time (15 or more credit hours per semester, fall and spring)

- Minimum 3.0/4.0 grade scale
- Meet program admission standards

*Scholarships awarded by department or Graduate School

transfer students

- Minimum cumulative GPA 3.0/4.0
 (U.S. grade scale) + 30 transfer credit hours
- Transfer credit hours are based on officially accepted hours from previously attended institution/institutions to WT
- Enrolled full-time (15 or more credit hours per semester, fall and spring)

immigration and visa information

what is an F1 student visa?

An F1 student visa is a non-immigrant visa type that allows you to enter the US as a full-time student at an accredited university or college.

what is an I-20?

An I-20 is a form that is issued by an accredited US university or college. This form is required to be able to attend an FI student visa interview.

The I-20 contains information about the student, the school, and the student's program of study.

how do I get an I-20?

Per the US Department of Homeland Security federal regulations, to obtain an I-20, a student must:

• Be fully admitted into the university

 Show financial verification (proof of finances) for at least 1 year of study

• Submit a copy of their Passport Biographic Page

residential living

The campus is home to 9 residence halls as well as a cafeteria open for breakfast, lunch and dinner. We recommend choosing either Jarrett Hall or Centennial Hall since these halls are open over the whole of winter break, when other residence halls and the rest of the university are closed and offer housing for all Meta Majors between them. Living on campus enables students to experience college life while concentrating on academic study and utilizing college facilities and activities. Facilities like the cafeteria, gym and library are easily accessible and within walking distance of all residence halls. WT does not provide family housing.

WT's University Police Department patrols 24 hours to keep the campus safe. Students can use the free shuttle bus service when available and have access to UPD's on-campus escort service at night. Not only is the campus environment a safe one, but the city of Canyon is one of the safest cities in the state of Texas.
