



Timely Warning Notification: Stalking & Domestic Violence

The Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act (Clery Act) is a federal law that requires colleges and universities across the United States to disclose information about crime on and around their campuses. A requirement of this law is timely notification to the campus community of certain crimes in a manner that will aid in the prevention of similar crimes.

STALKING & DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

On February 24, 2025, the University Police Department (UPD) received a report of stalking incidents and domestic violence occurring both on and off campus. The incidents were reported to have occurred from February 7th to 19th, 2025.

Crime victim rights and options, and stalking information were provided to the victim.

A few signs of an abusive relationship or stalking include:

- Assaultive abuse may be physical, emotional and/or verbal.
- Looks at you or acts in ways that scare you.
- Makes unwanted phone calls, texts, or social media posts.

How to help:

- Bystanders play a critical role in the prevention of sexual and relationship violence. Make the choice to intervene, speak up, or do something about it.
- Believe someone who discloses sexual assault, abusive behavior, or experience with stalking.
- Watch out for friends and fellow students or employees who look like they could be in trouble or need help. Ask if they are ok.
