

## **Timely Warning Notification: Stalking & Domestic Violence**

The Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act (Clery Act) is a federal law that requires colleges and universities across the United States to disclose information about crime on and around their campuses. A requirement of this law is timely notification to the campus community of certain crimes in a manner that will aid in the prevention of similar crimes.

## **STALKING & DOMESTIC VIOLENCE**

On February 24, 2025, the University Police Department (UPD) received a report of stalking incidents and domestic violence occurring both on and off campus. The incidents were reported to have occurred from February 7<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

Crime victim rights and options, and stalking information were provided to the victim.

A few signs of an abusive relationship or stalking include:

- Assaultive abuse may be physical, emotional and/or verbal.
- Looks at you or acts in ways that scare you.
- Makes unwanted phone calls, texts, or social media posts.

## How to help:

- Bystanders play a critical role in the prevention of sexual and relationship violence. Make the choice to intervene, speak up, or do something about it.
- Believe someone who discloses sexual assault, abusive behavior, or experience with stalking.
- Watch out for friends and fellow students or employees who look like they could be in trouble or need help. Ask if they are ok.
