



Timely Warning Notification: Fondling

The Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act (Clery Act) is a federal law that requires colleges and universities across the United States to disclose information about crime on and around their campuses. A requirement of this law is timely notification to the campus community of certain crimes in a manner that will aid in the prevention of similar crimes.

FONDLING

On November 20, 2025, the University Police Department (UPD) received a report involving a juvenile on campus. It was reported that the juvenile victim was touched inappropriately in an on-campus building. The incident was reported to have occurred between the 17th and 19th of November, 2025.

UPD and local agencies are currently investigating.

- Talk to your kids about inappropriate touching and safe resources for your child.
- Unwanted touching such as groping and touching of private body parts is inappropriate touching.
- Children cannot give permission or consent to sexual contact.
- Bystanders play a critical role in the prevention of sexual violence. Make the choice to intervene, speak up, or do something about it.
