



Timely Warning Notification: Stalking

The Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act (Clery Act) is a federal law that requires colleges and universities across the United States to disclose information about crime on and around their campuses. A requirement of this law is timely notification to the campus community of certain crimes in a manner that will aid in the prevention of similar crimes.

STALKING

On April 16, 2026, the University Police Department (UPD) received a report of harassment and stalking incidents occurring both on and off campus and in student housing. The incidents were reported to have occurred at various times since March 2026.

Crime victim rights and options, and stalking information were provided to the victim.

How to help:

- Bystanders play a critical role in the prevention of sexual and relationship violence. Make the choice to intervene, speak up, or do something about it.
- Believe someone who discloses sexual assault, abusive behavior, or experience with stalking.
- Watch out for friends and fellow students or employees who look like they could be in trouble or need help. Ask if they are ok.
