



Timely Warning Notice: Burglary

The Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act is a federal law that requires colleges and universities across the United States to disclose information about crime on and around their campuses. A requirement of this law is timely notification to the campus community of certain crimes in a manner that will aid in the prevention of similar crimes.

On Wednesday, May 6, 2026, the University was made aware of a burglary in an on campus residential facility. It was reported that a student's property was allegedly stolen from their dorm room while they were not present. The incident was reported to have occurred on May 5, 2026, between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

Per Clery Act definitions for reportable Clery Act crimes, unlawfully entering a structure to commit or have intent to commit a felony or theft is a Clery Act reportable burglary.

While nothing is failsafe, here are some suggestions everyone may want to consider:

- Lock all outside doors and windows before leaving your home or office.
- Ensure all locks are in proper working order.
- If arriving/returning to work or home and find an unexplained open/broken window or door – do not enter. Contact the Police.
- Do not touch or clean up until the police have inspected for evidence.
- Be a good neighbor. If you notice anything suspicious in your neighborhood, call 9-1-1 immediately.
