

### 12<sup>th</sup> Class Day Facts

The 12<sup>th</sup> class day enrollment numbers are in for Fall 2023. The data bite above is meant to depict what a professor would see when looking out into their classroom.

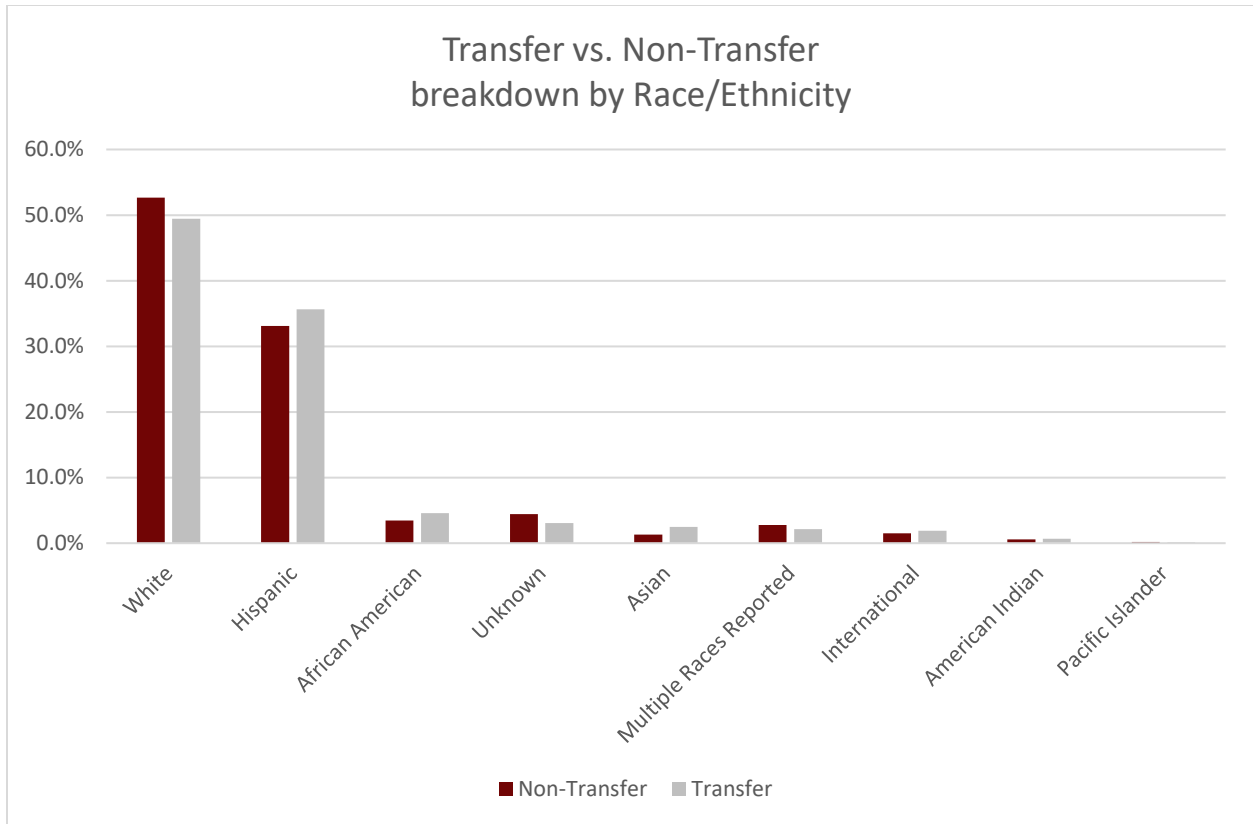
This semester we have focused on breaking down the undergraduate class into three additional demographics (traditional age (18-22), Pell grant and racially and ethnically diverse) into transfer or non-transfer students.

Since a little less than half of WT’s undergraduate population is classified as a transfer student at some point during time at WT, the Office of Institutional Effectiveness thought that it would be helpful to spotlight them.

Overall the biggest difference between transfer students and non-transfer students is their age. 43% of transfer students fall into the “traditionally aged undergraduate”, 18-22 category. Where as 90% of non-transfer students fall into this age group.

The average age for a transfer student is 27, whereas the average age for a non-transfer student is 20. The youngest transfer student enrolled this semester at WT is 17 years old, and the youngest non-transfer student is 15 years old.

With only a five percent difference between transfer and non-transfer students in regards to race and ethnicity, we decided to break it down further to see if there are any large gaps in each individual race/ethnicity. Overall, the two groups are very similar. Hispanic students have the largest gap with 2.5% more likely to be transfer students.
