This evaluation is meant to ensure that students are prepared to take courses involving theory and analysis at the graduate level, and that they have sufficient experience in this area on which to build for the required Oral Exams.

I. Analysis:

- You will be given one musical score and asked to answer analytic questions. These questions will cover some or all of the following:
 - o Harmonic (Roman numeral) analysis
 - o Form
 - o Non Chord Tones
 - o Cadences

Knowledge of the following terms will also help you greatly in the analysis portion of the evaluation.
