NOTE: At least 39 hours of advanced work (3000- or 4000-level courses) for which tuition is paid must be earned at WTAMU, and 30 of the final 36 hours counted toward the degree must be earned at WTAMU. A maximum of 60 semester hours in mass communication (MCOM), six hours in religion (RELI) and six hours in physical education (PHED) can be counted toward a degree. Broadcasting, Electronic Media majors may not count more than 43 hours of MCOM courses toward the degree; therefore, all elective hours should be in non-MCOM subjects.

NOTE: This is NOT a degree plan. After completing 30 hours, students are encouraged to request an official degree plan by using the online <u>Degree Plan</u> <u>Request</u> form. The dean's office of the Sybil B. Harrington College of Fine Arts and Humanities, located in Mary Moody Northen Hall, Room 181 (or call 806-651-2782), can answer questions about the degree plan. Students who have completed 45 hours will not be allowed to progress without requesting a degree plan.

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
