A basic or transfer student who is <u>not</u> enrolled in courses in one of the four official nursing semesters (Junior I, Junior II, Senior I, and Senior II) is considered to be a Pre-Nursing major, Code 700. When a student is admitted to the WTAMU BSN program and begins Junior I nursing courses, the major code is changed to Code 701, unless the student is a registered LVN, in which case the major is changed to 713.
