counted toward a degree

NOTE: This is NOT a degree plan. After completing 30 hours, students are encouraged to request an official degree plan by using the online <u>Degree Plan Request</u> form. The dean's office of the Sybil B. Harrington College of Fine Arts and Humanities, located in Mary Moody Northen Hall, Room 181 (or call 806-651-2782), can answer questions about the degree plan. Students who have completed 45 hours will not be allowed to progress without requesting a degree plan.

NOTES AND PREREQUISITES:

*If developmental courses are needed or no college credit hours, delay MUSI 1307 until the spring semester. *Generally, a grade of "C" is required to advance to the next level of piano and theory/aural skills courses. *MUSI 1311 + 1116; 1312 + 1117; 2311 + 2116; 2312 + 2117 are concurrent enrollment courses.

*Enrollment in core curriculum courses, which should be completed as early as possible, during intersessions and summer sessions will reduce course loads during the fall and spring semesters.
