Dia de los Muertos – A Celebration of Life



Each fall, the WTAMU College of Education and Social Sciences hosts a celebration of *Dia de los Muertos* (Day of the Dead) on the WTAMU campus. WTAMU students and community participants under the outstanding leadership of our faculty and staff design and install *ofrendas* (altars) celebrating the lives of individuals of personal or professional importance to them. The campus and community actively participate in the week-long events associated with the celebration. The events have been well attended and very positively received by the community.

Highlights of the 2015 Celebration of Life

- ❖ 100 ofrendas were on display in the Panhandle Plains Historical Museum with increased participation from outside the University community
- **❖** 380 attended the fund-raising Gala in 2 venues
- ❖ 17 public school student groups (500 children) viewed the *ofrendas* in the Museum and participated in educational and art activities
- ❖ 5 fine area restaurants contributed and served (at no cost) food for the Gala dinner
- **❖** 25 WTAMU faculty and staff members in the College actively contributed their talent and hard work during the week to make the event a success
- Grammy-nominated singer Micky Cruz and his Band performed at the Gala to standing ovations
- ★ The 2015 event generated contributions and underwriting in excess of \$45,000 all proceeds were contributed to Scholarships in the College of Education and Social Sciences

The success of the celebration prompts us to continually expand this interesting and important cultural event. *Dia de los Muertos* is a holiday celebrated in Mexican and in most Hispanic cultures and increasingly throughout the southwestern United States. The holiday focuses on gatherings to remember friends and family members who have died. It is celebrated throughout Mexico, where it attains the quality of a national holiday. The celebration takes place on November 1–2. Traditions connected with the holiday include building private altars (*ofrendas*) honoring the deceased using sugar skulls, marigolds, and the favorite foods and beverages of the departed, together with traditional and contemporary music. The celebration is a **joyous** one – we have emphasized that the WTAMU event is *A Celebration of Life!*

We have developed a high visibility, annual event that showcases the **WTAMU College of Education and Social Sciences** and our outstanding students while generating funds for scholarships in the college. **All**

proceeds from the event support scholarships in the college including a newly established scholarship benefiting Latino students.

Gala Dinner (7-10 pm) – **JBK Legacy Hall** featuring dancing to the music of Grammy-nominated singer and songwriter *Micky Cruz* and his band.

Tickets \$75 each including Gala Reception, Dinner, and Dancing (Cash Bar).

Grammy nominated artist, **Micky Cruz** was born in Nicaragua. He was orphaned at the age of two when his family was killed in the Nicaraguan war in the late 1970s. He raised himself on the streets of Central America and Mexico. Micky is a self-taught musician and composer who writes and produces all of his own music. Micky Cruz has performed extensively throughout the southwest and is an award winning New Mexico musician having received the coveted *Los 15 Grandes* award several times in past years! Micky's music is best described as Cumbia, Salsa, and Reggae with an interesting, refreshing twist where Micky has combined styles together and invented "Cumbegue" music.
