The Future of Cattle Feeding: Texas Cattle Feeders Feedyard Technician Program Comes to WTAMU!



The TCFA Feedyard Technician program is hosted by the WT Department of Agricultural Sciences at the Stanley Schaeffer Agricultural Education Learning Lab. October 22-24, around 150 students from across Texas came and competed. Students participated in six criteria of the certification program. These criteria consist of an interview with industry leaders, a multiple choice test, a walk-through demonstration of a lock-out/tag-out scenario, an oxy-fuel cutting demonstration, oxy-fuel heating/bending demonstration, and an arc welding

demonstration. Students were tested on their comprehension and ability to perform each demonstration.

The objective of the TCFA Feedyard Technician Program is to enlist the support of Agricultural Science teachers in identifying high school juniors and seniors and to offer educational experiences needed to provide students with knowledge and skills needed to prepare them for a potential career in the fed-cattle industry.

Alumni Achievements



Luke Smith is a recent graduate who attributes his success in being accepted into Oxford University to West Texas A&M University faculty. Smith earned a bachelor's degree in professional chemistry in May from West Texas A&M University, and four months and 5,000 miles later, he was back in his home country at what many say is the foremost collegiate research university in the world.

"I honestly never expected that I would get here," Smith said.

"But if I didn't apply, I would never know. Obviously, there are a number of colleges known throughout the world. Being from England, Oxford was the one I always thought about. Never did I think I'd ever get here though."

Smith is enrolled in the master's program at Oxford. At the end of the academic year, he will undergo a "transfer of status," where he will learn if he's suitable to continue on for his doctorate. If so, he will pursue a doctorate over about four years in physical and theoretical chemistry. The surprise of acceptance has worn off in place of the road ahead. Smith's work is primarily research-based on protein interactions and structural conformations.
