Students can find their textbooks using our University Bookstore, and the <u>Schedule & Reserve/Buy Books</u> link in Buff Advisor, but students can also choose to secure their text books from other merchants. To help our students we've complied a pros and cons list of making purchases through the University Bookstore.

Pros of University Bookstore

- Books can be bundled a head of time using the Buff Advisor link. Students can then pick up and pay for all their books all at once without having to wait in line.
- University Bookstore Staff are available to help you with any questions you have.
- Any book purchase through the University Bookstore can be returned for a full refund for up to 30 days after purchase with receipt. This is especially helpful in the event that an instructor or professor decides not to use a textbook for the semester.
- Students can purchase their books immediately and be ready for class without delay.
- Some books are only available in the University Bookstore such as lab manuals and developmental course texts
- Some books are available to rent for as low as \$40 for the semester, and still have the option to buy it at the end of the semester if you want to keep it.
- Sponsored billing students with approval for books and supplies can get all items through the
 university bookstore with appropriate documentation submitted to the Accounting and Business
 Office.
- The University Bookstore may be the only way to purchase an eText keys for online books used for many courses.
- Books can be sold back at the end of the semester for cash in hand
- The University Bookstore is the only book vendor that accepts the Buff Gold Card for book voucher and emergency book loan fund usage.
- Books will not be delayed or damaged in the mail.

Cons of University Bookstore

• If you wait to purchase books, the University Bookstore could run out of text and then you will have to purchase your book(s) elsewhere.

- Books could potentially be found with other companies and websites for a lower price.
- Students may be able to resell any texts they do not want to keep for a higher price online than with the University Bookstore.

Helpful tip! Remember to save all of your textbook and class supply receipts as these are all educational expense that can be used when filing taxes, along with the 1098-T form WT will issue resident students. Please be sure to work with a tax professional when using these documents.
