
While MATH 1332 and 1350 will fulfill core math requirements, they will NOT epare students for higher-level math courses such as Plane Trigonometry (MATH 16) or Pre-Calculus (MATH 2412).

DTE I: The Capstone will be completed during the student's senior year. In addition the successful completion of ENGL 4390, requirements include a portfolio and esentation to be evaluated by the capstone assessment committee. Refer to the glish Major's Handbook for additional information.

DTE II: At least 39 hours of advanced work (3000- or 4000-level courses) for which tion is paid must be earned at WTAMU, and 30 of the final 36 hours counted ward the degree must be earned at WTAMU. A maximum of 60 semester hours English, six hours in religion (RELI) and six hours in physical education (PHED) n be counted toward a degree.

ote: This is NOT a degree plan. After completing 30 hours, students are ncouraged to request an official degree plan in the office of the dean of the Sybil . Harrington College of Fine Arts and Humanities, located in Mary Moody for then Hall, Room 161 (or call 806-651-2777). Students who have completed 45 ours will not be allowed to progress without requesting a degree plan.



DISCLAIMER: This curriculum guide should be used in conjunction with the corresponding degree checklist for general planning purposes only. The degree checklist (later a student's official degree plan) should be referred to as the comprehensive list of all courses required for the degree. An official degree plan is required after completing 45 hours. Students should always seek the advice of their academic adviser before scheduling classes.

Notes:

* Core 90: 1-3 hours. Lab hours for 4-hour Core 30 (science) courses and extra hour from 4-hour Core 20 courses must be counted in Core 90. English majors may not take ENGL 1101 for Core 90 because the program already requires the maximum of 60 semester credit hours in English.

** Six hours is required from ENGL 2321, 2326, 2331, 2341, and 2343. If one of these is taken for Core 40, then only one additional course is needed.

*** 1-3 hours, depending on whether foreign language courses are 3 or 4 hours each.

**** ENGL 4310 may be substituted with adviser approval.
