

WTAMU Experiential Education Program Spring 2019 Executive Summary

The Experiential Education program (formerly Cooperative Education) began in the spring of 1994. A Title VIII Department of Education grant started the program, and we placed the first students in the spring of 1994. Our vital statistics to date include:

- Monitored or documented 4,883 individual placements to date (279 in Spring 2019)
- Unduplicated count of internships in 2018-19 to date 465
- ➤ Average GPA of the Spring 2019 class 3.3754
- > Average wage for paid internships for the Spring 2019 class \$13.42 per hour






Intern to Full-Time for Spring 2019

At the time of this report, 194 out of the 279 spring interns have graduated. Here is the breakdown of outcomes we know about:

- * 121 have full-time jobs
- * 19 are attending graduate school
- * 12 we have no information on
- * 1 is classified as other
- * 11 are working part-time
- * 3 are working on post-graduation internships
- * 26 are searching
- * 1 is volunteering

Spring 2019 Interns

Out of the 279 interns,

- * 43% got full-time positions
- * 7% are going to graduate school
- * 4% are working part-time
- * 2% are completing a post-graduation internship/volunteering/other

That means 56% are working in some form or fashion.

* 14% are either searching or we were unable to contact them.

* 30% of them are either continuing their internship, seeking another internship and/or pursuing their degree.

Internships continue to be an effective way for students to gain major-related experience and in many cases, a professional position upon graduation!
