Some majors specify particular courses to meet core curriculum requirements when options are available.

\*\* While MATH 1332 and 1350 will fulfill core math requirements, they will NOT prepare students for higher-level math courses such as Plane Trigonometry (MATH 1316) or Pre-Calculus (MATH 2412).

\*\*\* Or an equivalent course (second year, second semester) in a foreign language.

NOTE I: At least 39 hours of advanced work (3000- or 4000-level courses) for which tuition is paid must be earned at WTAMU; 30 of the final 36 hours counted toward the degree must be earned at WTAMU. No more than 60 semester hours in art (ARTS) can be counted toward this degree. A maximum of six semester hours in religion (REL) and a maximum of six semester hours in physical education (PHED) courses can count toward a baccalaureate degree.

NOTE II: Art majors (B.A. or B.S.) interested in gallery management, museum work or other art/business possibilities should normally select Studio Art and Management or Art History Emphasis and take support courses in ACCT 2301, 2302, BUSI 1301, MKT 3340, MGT 3330, 3332 (prerequisites: ACCT 2301, ACCT 2302 and FIN 3320).

**NOTE: This is NOT a degree plan. After completing 30 hours, students are encouraged to request an official degree plan by using the online [Degree Plan Request](#) form. The dean's office of the Sybil B. Harrington College of Fine Arts and Humanities, located in Mary Moody Northen Hall, Room 181 (or call 806-651-2782), can answer questions about the degree plan. Students who have completed 45 hours will not be allowed to progress without requesting a degree plan.**
