

## West Texas A&M University Cooperative Education / Internship Program Spring 2006 Executive Summary

The co-op / internship program at WTAMU began in the spring of 1994. A Title VIII Department of Education grant started the program, and we placed the first students in the spring of 1994. Our vital statistics to date include:

- Monitored 1265 individual placements to date (49 in Spring 2006)
- Placed 609 students in paid internships (unduplicated count)
- Average GPA of the Spring 2006 class – 3.213
- Average wage for the Spring 2006 class - \$11.33 per hour
- Total dollars earned by the Spring 2006 class - \$153,925
- Total dollars earned by all co-op / internship students to date - \$4,278,145

In the academic year-to-date, the co-op / internship program has also helped 1,478 students through both online and in-person résumé workshops. Additionally, our counselors have provided career counseling to 188 students to date during the 2005-06 school year. This counseling and guidance helps students determine their best career path.

### Intern to Full-Time for Spring 2006

This semester 9 of our 49 interns placed graduated. Six found full-time positions, two are attending graduate school, and one is still seeking employment.
